Toronto survey for the National Ethnic Press and Media Council of Canada

Release Date: November 13, 2024






Liaison surveyed a random sample of 855 Torontonians through Interactive Voice Recording (IVR) from November 8-10, 2024

Responses were weighted using demographic and geographic information to targets based on the 2021 Census.

The margin of error for survey results is ± 3.35 percentage points, 19 times out of 20 for the total. Margins of error are higher for sub samples.




#### **Mayoral Approval - Toronto Residents**

Q: Do you approve or disapprove of the job Olivia Chow is doing as Mayor of Toronto?












