There's no tougher race than an election campaign. Shifting headlines, commentaries on leadership debates, and millions of voters changing their minds right up to the last minute. In the most recent 2025 elections, the accuracy of Liaison's polls ranked 1st provincially and 2nd federally. Next race, who knows? There's always room to improve. **Even at Liaison.**

Methodology

Liaison surveyed a random sample of 1,000 Canadians **from January 5 to January 17, 2026**, using Interactive Voice Recording (IVR) technology. The sample was evenly split between the two weeks. To ensure a representative sample, participants were reached through random digit dialing (RDD) across both landline and cellular phone networks.

The resulting data was weighted to match targets based on the 2021 Census. For the total sample, the **margin of error is ±3.1 percentage points**, 19 times out of 20, though this margin is higher for sub-samples. Additionally, results may not add up to 100% due to rounding.



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

In the last 12 months, have you or a member of your immediate household **visited a Hospital Emergency Room?**



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

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
How would you rate the length of time you waited to be seen by a physician during your most recent visit?





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

Do you believe Independent Health Providers, such as **private clinics, should play a larger role in delivering universally funded healthcare** services?



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
